forth and do likewise at our jobs, with our families and in our neighborhoods.




# Bach-a-Thon 2019



#### World Premiere Opera by Chapter Member

Apollo 13 is a new opera in two acts by **Matthew Burke** that tells the true story of the 3rd moon landing mission that faced overwhelming obstacles to their survival in the form of an oxygen tank explosion. Through the quick thinking of the men and women of NASA they were able to survive the trip and became a shining example of triumph in the face of adversity. I chose this story to write something inspirational, to show that we can achieve great things if we work together and to pay tribute to the Apollo era and their marvelous scientific and engineering feats. The space setting was also of musical inspiration to me as I am a church organist who regularly uses that instrument to create scenes of majesty and wonder.

The main musical motive of the piece is the dialog between mission control, played by a men's choir, and the 3 astronauts, played by tenor and baritone vocal soloists. Marilyn

Lovell, wife of Jim Lovell, the mission commander is depicted by a soprano and has many moments of reflection throughout the opera. The music itself encompasses a range of styles from Baroque and classical to progressive rock to capture the wide range of emotions present during the harrowing journey of Apollo 13.
