Dr. Yu has been the music director at the Cathedral of St. Paul in Worcester, Mass. She has been the conductor of the Boston University Women's Chorus, the Boulder Chorale, the Schola Cantorum of Kansas City, and the Beijing University Chorus. She received her doctorate from Boston University, studying with Ann Howard Jones. One of my favorite quotes about choral conducting comes from Dr. Jones:

"I know of no other activity where access to the most profound artistic works can be made possible and satisfying for the participant who has limited skills as an individual but whose capacity is enlarged by the group."

We have all experienced that thrill and miracle of choral music, where the result is so much more than the sum of its parts!


