Dr. Lei Yu is principal guest conductor of The Harmonia Choir in both Beijing and Kunming, China. She travels to China twice per year to train music educators and conductors. Dr. Yu has been the music director at the Cathedral of St. Paul in Worcester, Mass. She has been the conductor of the Boston University Women's Chorus, the Boulder Chorale, the Schola Cantorum of Kansas City, and the Beijing University Chorus. She received her doctorate from Boston University, studying with Ann Howard Jones.



The morning workshop will include a segment on choral technique, a segment on expressive gestures entitled "Conducting the Image of Music" and a masterclass opportunity for three or four participants. This could also include conducting from the organ console. Dr. Yu will choose from the list of pieces for the masterclass.
