After contacting Stephen, each performer will get in touch with Shawn to set up a recording session. You may perform at First Presbyterian in Dunedin, Prince of Peace Lutheran or at your own church location. Shawn will bring everything necessary to make the recording. These recordings will occur in early October so that Shawn has enough time to edit them together into a concert video.

The video will be uploaded ahead of time and released for viewing on October 30 on our AGO webpage, the First Presbyterian Church webpage and perhaps other sites as well. We will set up a way for those watching the performance to easily text a donation to the Clearwater AGO during the broadcast.

The United Methodist Church of Sun City Center, 1210 Del Webb Blvd. West, welcomes back theater organ virtuoso, **Tom Hoehn** for a September 4, 7:00 pm performance of the Buster Keaton silent movie, *Cops*, followed by an organ concert of pop music and show tunes. Hoehn will present all the organ music on the church's Rodgers Infinity organ.

Tom is a Clearwater Chapter member and Organist at First United Methodist Church, Clearwater. He has extensive training and experience as a theater organ specialist. Over the years he has appeared as the stadium organist for the Tampa Bay Rowdies, the Florida State Fair Association organist, and at the Tampa Theatre and Polk Theatre in Lakeland with The Smothers Brothers. He also composed and recorded the sound track for the puppet animation film, *Harker*, in 2005 at the Polk Theatre. Mr. Hoehn has also regularly appeared as a silent film organ artist at Vizcaya Museum and Gardens in Miami. Theatre organ is a true passion for him! The church will employ CDC recommended safety measures including masks (they can give you one if you don't have one), social distancing and 25% venue capacity, which means the first 175 persons only will be admitted.

A donation of only \$5 is requested at the door on the night of the concert.

From the Editor:

For those of us that continue in a church or synagogue position, most have read and researched regarding the dangers of group singing during this Covid-19 time. The thoughts of many are that to re-


turn to worship without singing is almost as bad as not meeting together at all. Two recent preliminary studies give some guidance and good information and can be accessed through The Center for Congregational Singing (a division of The Hymn Society of the United States and Canada). These studies from Colorado and Munich (the second in German) give us hope that this will not be forever but cautions that now wind instruments (especially Oboe, French Horn, Tuba) as well as theatrical speech is dangerous along with singing.

A summary on the site gives us clear language to use if those in our circles of influence need convincing of the danger:

As of today, we continue to err on the side of caution, not because we are fearful but because we are faithful. We believe that the health and lives of congregations across the U.S. are more important than any single act of music-making. God calls us to love and care for our neighbors. There will be a time we can sing together in our churches again, but the two studies referenced above do not provide scientific evidence that it is safe for a congregation to do so right now. They should give us hope, but they should not give us permission. The scientists leading the studies have said as much. So please reference these studies and continue to look for updates. But do not be fooled or allow yourselves to read those studies as scientific proof that there are risk-free ways of singing together.

In Memoriam

Donald L. Hand

November 3, 1941—July 22, 2020



Long-time chapter member, Don Hand died in July. Don and his wife Shirley have been friends of the Clearwater Chapter for many years. Don is well-known as both a builder and player of organs and had most recently served Anona United Methodist Church in Largo FL. A graveside service for Don was held Saturday, August 8, 2020. This is the obituary as shared from the website of Dignity Memorial:

HAND, Donald Lewis, 78, of Clearwater, died July 22 after a hospitalization due to Covid-19. He was born in Glen Rock, NJ on November 3, 1941 and was a descendent of Elder William Brewster of the Mayflower Pilgrims. Don graduated Duke University with a BA in History and served in the U.S. Army from 1968-72. He was a pipe organ design engineer with Austin Organs for many years, a member of the American Guild of Organists, and an accomplished organist and carillonneur, leading choirs at the many churches he served in Connecticut and Florida. He was proud of his over 100 organ installations, particularly those at the Inter-American University Chapel in Puerto Rico, The Shiroishi White Cube Concert Hall in Japan, and his final project, First Baptist in Washington, DC. Don loved his family, was a passionate musician, reader, and history buff, and, as a man of great faith, dedicated much of his time to service of the church. He loved to experience life and traveled extensively. He was predeceased by his parents, Homer and Anna-May Hand, and his daughter, Kimberly Pearce. He is survived by his wife of 35 years, Shirley, his sister Judy Gardner (Mort), his uncle, Bill Lewis (Elaine), his sons, David, Jonathan (Allyson), Mark (Kacie), and Christopher, his daughter, Karen Young (Jeff), and his eleven grandchildren. Due to pandemic, memorial services will be scheduled later.
