

# **Obituary**

**Donald "Don" Rolander,** 80 years old, All Saints' Day, Nov. 1, 2022, in Largo FL. He was born in Princeton, IL on July 15, 1942 to Robert and Irene Rolander. He is preceded in death by his parents and brother Richard Rolander.

Don began piano lessons with his mother at the age of 8 and accepted his first church music position at 13 years old. In 1960 he graduated from the Sherwood Music School in Chicago. Organ teachers were Dr. Herbert L. White, Max Janowski, Benjamin Hadley, and Diane Bish. After moving to Florida in 1969, Don was employed by Trinity Lutheran Church in St. Petersburg and Temple Beth-El in Clearwater. He briefly served at St. Paul Lutheran in Clearwater. In 1975 he joined the



staff at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Largo FL as Parish Musician where he oversaw the installation of Austin/Colby op. 2089/318 and founded the concert series *Art for Faith's Sake*. In 1976, Don presented a recital program throughout the country celebrating the American Bicentennial. He produced an album recorded at Prince of Peace Lutheran (Largo, FL), Coral Ridge Presbyterian (Ft. Lauderdale, FL), and Evangelical Covenant Church (Princeton, IL). That same year, Don joined Suncoast Concert Management as Vice President where he oversaw the recording, editing, and production of Diane Bish's earliest albums. After serving 42 years, Don retired from Prince of Peace Lutheran Church on All Saints' Sunday, Nov. 5, 2017.

Don served two terms as Dean of the Clearwater Chapter of the AGO. He served as Dean of the Inter-Lutheran Commission on Worship Conference held at Eckerd College. He was a founding member of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians. He taught and mentored countless organ students and church musicians in the Tampa Bay area. A memorial celebration of life was held November 11 at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church with a generous amount of festive music provided by the Prince of Peace Parish Choir lead by Dr. Shawn Thomas with organ, piano and a brass quintet.
