Summer Workshop Experience

Have you seen or heard of the “Freeing the Caged Bird” video? I had the privilege this summer of attending the Lister-Sink Institute 2023 Intensive Injury Preventive Keyboard Technique Workshop incorporating the Alexander Technique at Salem College in North Carolina. I was one of seventeen participants from across the US and Canada. Our experience with the keyboard ranged from a retiree who hadn’t played in fifty years and is learning to play songs for her church school to international piano and organ artists. Injury related reasons for coming that were shared included localized pain to five broken fingers on one hand.

Barbara Lister-Sink, Ed.D. C. T., led the workshop with thirteen assistants who came from five countries on three continents. Over six days we had whole group sessions, small group sessions with Dr. Lister-Sink on the Lister-Sink Method and with Susan C. Perkins, MAmSAT, on the Alexander Technique. We also had individual sessions with Dr. Lister-Sink and daily private sessions with an assistant. We learned about tools for support, both physical and technological.

My experience in a nutshell? It’s all about bio-mechanical physics. We were immersed in the most basic movements involved in playing just one note called the “Basic Stroke.” The highlight of my week? With the help of Dr. Lister-Sink, my short fingers played consecutive thirty-second note triplets across a tenth feeling light as a feather. My goal every practice session is to achieve that same awareness and lack of tension. Having had a taste of this whole new world, I look forward to continuing my studies of both the Lister-Sink Method and the Alexander Technique.
